There is a web site entitled, "The Art of Manliness" whose purpose is to help recover the lost art of manliness. A recent article suggested that we (our American society) bring back "old fashioned insults" because our current culture language has not adequately replaced these "clever, nuanced, descriptive and quite amusing" put-downs. I guess we men need to develop better insults.

A couple of examples will remind some of you of these subtle insults. "White-livered" is someone who is cowardly or malicious. A "wrinkler" is someone prone to lying. Someone who is "rum bumptious" is considered pompous or haughty. A "dunderhead" is a blockhead. A "duke of limbs" is a tall, awkward fellow. President Theodore Roosevelt was a master of insults. Some that he used are "classical ignoramus," "fragrant man swine," "miserable little snob," and "infernal skunk."

I suppose we all at times feel like insulting someone. As disciples of Jesus we should remember that our words will judge us (Matthew 12:36-37). The reason for this is that whatever inhabits the heart will eventually come out (Matthew 12:34) through our words. The words we use and the purpose we use them for reveals what dwells in our hearts.

Paul encourages us to never let an "unwholesome word" (Ephesians 4:29 NASB) come out of our mouths. Instead we should speak to "edify" and "give grace" to those we are addressing (Ephesians 4:29). This doesn't mean that we cannot speak critical words because sometimes we need to be set straight and by speaking critical words (in an edifying and helpful way) we can help someone grow.

Our speech should always be directed at helping. We must always think of ourselves as servants to each other and those around us. May your speech reflect your growth in Christ and may your speech draw others to Jesus. -Bob-

People from the community can take anything they can use.

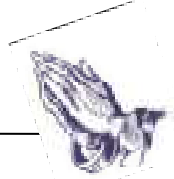
